First Aider

Our volunteers are trained in first aid to treat all sorts of injuries ranging from headaches to heart attacks. They use these skills to provide first aid treatment at a wide variety of public events including Ascot and Windsor races, football and rugby matches at Madejski Stadium and a variety of fetes and shows.

Commitment

Our local groups typically meet once a week for training and social activities and we cover public events every week throughout the year. It is up to you how much time you wish to dedicate and how many duties you attend. We appreciate any time that you have to offer.



Many of our first aid

volunteers go on to progress to other roles within first aid volunteering, these might include ambulance attendant, ambulance driver and first aid trainer.

Training

You don't need any previous first aid experience, as our training will equip you with all the skills you need for the role.

Youth Leader

In addition to adult members St John Ambulance also has members aged between 5 and 18 divided into Badgers (5-10) and Cadets (10-18).

Over half of St John Ambulance's 43,000 volunteers across the country are under the age of 18, making us a major youth organisation. Youth leaders play a crucial part in the development of thousands of young people by broadening their horizons and helping them to realise their potential.



Commitment

Badgers and Cadets typically meet once a week for training and social activities. Some of our youth leaders are also first aiders who attend public duties, however this is optional and we are grateful for any time that you can spare.

Training

We are looking for people who are committed and passionate about youth work. You should be willing to learn new skills and help to develop young people.

You don't need any previous first aid or youth leading experience; we will provide full training for the role.

Support Roles

You can help us to save lives without ever picking up a first aid kit. Volunteers who help behind the scenes in a support role are vital to our work. If you are able to spare as little as 2 hours a week or month, one of the following roles may be for you.

Fundraisers

Our county fundraiser organises a number of fundraising events across Berkshire each year ranging from collections to concerts and we are always in need of people to go out into the community to raise money for our good cause.

Administrators

Our volunteers are busy people and although we are a charity we are still obliged to complete the necessary formalities to accompany our work. Could you spare some time to help us so that our volunteers can concentrate on what they do best-saving lives?

Communications

Some of our larger events require the use of radio communications in order for our first aiders to stay in contact with each other and be called to emergencies within minutes of them happening.

Public Relations

We believe that it is important to sing the praises of our organisation and make sure that our work is recognised by the local community. In this role you will provide a vital link between our volunteers and the county headquarters enabling our PR officer to publicise St John Ambulance in Berkshire.
